Gosnell, by deed bearing date May 19, 1879, and recorded in said office on July 8, 1879, in Deed Book "J.J.", at page 569; and said John M. Gosnell having thereupon conveyed to the late John H. Goodwin a portion of said tract, containing 100 acres and first above described, by deed bearing date April 1, 1881, and recorded in said office on May 12, 1885, in Deed Book "O.O.", at page 718; and said tract having been included in a deed executed by Walter Blake Goodwin and Joseph Prioleau Goodwin, executors of the said John H. Goodwin, deceased, to Thomas Wilson, by deed bearing date February 21, 1900, and recorded in said office on March 3, 1900, in Deed Book "D.D.D.", at page 779; said tract of land having also been included in a deed executed to me by the said Thomas Wilson, bearing date the 27th day of April, 1903;
