Durham, Della Durham (now Della Plumley), Julia Durham, Rosa Durham, and William Durham, the first two named of which children are now above twenty one years of age, while the five last named children are still minors; and the said parties having agreed to sell said land to me the said R. E. Johnston, and the said Susan Durham, having instituted a proceeding in the Court of Common Pleas for the County of Greenville, in said state, on February 19, 1904. against W. N. Durham, et al.; praying the said Court to direct the execution of a deed conveying to me the said R. E. Johnston the interest of the said five minor children in said land; and a decree having been accordingly rendered by the said Court, bearing date April 15, 1904, directing the Master for Greenville County to execute such a deed; and such a deed having been duly executed in obedience to such decree by D.P. Verner Esq. Master for said county bearing date June 17, 1904 and recorded in the office last mentioned on June 18, 1904. in Deed Book "KKK." at page 74, (see judgement roll Number A"2201, in the office of the clerk of Court for Greenville County), and the said Susan Durham, Richard C. Durham, and Emma Ross having released to me, the said R. E. Johnston All their respective undivided interest in the said land by deed bearing date April 5, 1904, and recorded in the office of the Register of Meane Conveyances for Greenville County on June 18, 1904. in Deed Book, "LLL." at page 717; and the said John B. Cleveland having also released to me, the said R. E.
