THE STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA.

EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

By the Secretary of State.

Whereas, C.C. Westmoreland and F.C. Westmoreland, both of Greenville S.C., did on the 1st day of Nov. 1904 file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves setting forth:

FIRST: The names and residences of the said petitioners to be as above given.

SECOND: The name of the proposed corporation be that of Westmoreland Drug Manufacturing Co.

THIRD: The principal place of business of the corporation will be Greenville S.C.

FOURTH: The general purpose of the corporation, and the nature of business it proposes to do, is to manufacture and bottle flavoring extracts, essences, and all other bottled goods, used by drug and grocery stores, with power to do all acts necessary or usual for the conduct of such business, including the power to purchase and lease real estate for the establishment of a plant.

FIFTH: The amount of the capital stock to be two thousand dollars, and the number of shares into which the same is to be divided to be twenty of the par value of one hundred dollars each.

SIXTH: The capital stock to be payable as set forth in the Declaration.

AND WHEREAS, on 1st November, 1904 the said C.C. Westmoreland and F.C. Westmoreland were appointed members of a Board of Directors of the said corporation.

AND WHEREAS, the said Board of Corporators, on the 10th Nov. 1904 did file with the Secretary of State their return in writing, over their signatures, certifying, among other things, that pursuant to publish notice as required in the commission of the said Corporators, the Books of subscription to the capital stock of the aforesaid Company were duly opened, and that thereupon exceeding fifty per centum of the capital stock was subscribed by bona fide stockholders; that thereupon a meeting of stockholders was called, and the aforesaid Company duly organized by the election of a Board of Directors, and other necessary officers. That, furthermore, they have complied with all the requirements of the Code of Laws of the State of South Carolina, of 1902, and all Acts or parts amendatory thereto;

NOW, THEREFORE I, J.T. Gantt, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purpose indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Means Conveyance in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.

Whereas, on the 27th day of February 1897 a declaration was filed in the office of the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas for said County, by A. Viola Neblett, M.P. Gridley, F.P. Dill, C.W. Taylor, N. Tompkins, S.E. Sistrone, W.R. Hale, E.B.L. Taylor, C.F. Dill, G.W. Sistrone, and M.J. Putman, praying for a certificate of incorporation for the NEBLETT FREE LIBRARY ASSOCIATION; And it appearing by said declaration that the declarants above named are each and all of them residents of the City of Greenville in the State aforesaid, and are desirous of obtaining a certificate of incorporation as aforesaid for the said association, to be located in the said City of Greenville under the name of the NEBLETT FREE LIBRARY ASSOCIATION, for the purpose of establishing and maintaining a public library and lyceum and promoting the education and culture of said City, and they desire said certificate to be granted to them, their successors and associates and to such other persons as may become members of said association, with power to make by-laws not inconsistent with the laws of the said State or the United States for the government of said association, to have and use a common seal and the same to change at pleasure, and to sue and be sued and plead and be impleaded, to have, hold and keep such real and personal property as may be proper and necessary for corporate purposes and the same to sell, alien, mortgage or otherwise dispose of at the will of said corporation, and any other powers common to such corporations and consistent with the laws of the land;
