Plumley, a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Greenville, and State of South Carolina, on branch waters of Austin Belows Mill Creek waters of South Facolet River, begining on the Creek at Austin Belows line running nearly N.W. to a Sowerwood corner thence nearly N.W. to a red Oak, thence from the Red Oak with the road to a Chestnut, thence nearly N. by an Apple tree a large cliff of rocks thence with the ledge of Rocks, - to the branch, thence down said branch, to the begining corner, containing one hundred acres, more or less,
Together with all and singular the rights, Members, Hereditaments, and Appurtenances, to the said premises belonging, or in any wise incident or appertaining to the said premises,

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the said premises before mentioned unto the said, G.W. Plumley his heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors, and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular, the said premises unto the said G.W. Plumley, his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs, and against every other person or persons, whomsoever lawfully claiming, or to claim, the same or any part thereof.
