Mills, by deed bearing date September 22, 1858, and recorded in the last mentioned office on November 9, 1891, in Deed Book "W.W.", at page 658; the said W.S. Mills having released on the margin of the last mentioned deed all his interest in the said tract of land to the said Govan Mills on the 15th day of November, 1859; and the said Govan Mills having thereafter died seized and possessed of the said tract of land; and the same having been subsequently sold as a part of his real estate under a decree of the Court of Equity for the distric (new County) of Spartanburg, in said State rendered during the June term of said Court, in the year 1868, in a proceeding brought in the said Court, by Thomas K. Cureton and Nancy R. Mills, Administrator and Administratrix, and Mary S. Cureton, against Richard H. Mills, J. Columbus Mills et al; and conveyed in pursuance of the said decree by T. Stobo Farrow, Commissioner of said Court of Equity, to Columbus Mills, the purchaser at said sale, by deed bearing date October 5, 1868, and recorded in the last mentioned office on April 1, 1875, in Deed Book "G.G.", at page 283; and conveyed by the said Columbus Mills to the late L.N. Wilcox, by deed bearing date the - day of - 1872, and recorded in the last mentioned office on December 3, 1874, Deed Book "F.F.", at page 726; and by the said L.N. Wilcox conveyed to Andy Berry Henson and Lewis F. Henson by deed bearing date October 7, 1895, and recorded in the last mentioned office on February 12, 1901, in Deed Book "G.G.G.", at page 721; the said Andy Berry Henson having died intestate during the year 1901, and a proceeding having been instituted in the Court of Common Pleas for Greenville County, in said State, on or about the 17th day of January, A.D. 1905, by Fairrads Waldrep (daughtor of the said Andy Berry Henson) against Vance Henson et al, to obtain a portion of the said tract of land among the heirs at law and distributees of the said Andy Berry Henson and Lewis F. Henson, in which proceeding a decree was rendered by the Honorable George E. Prince, Judge of aforesaid Court, bearing date the 17th day of March 1905, ordering that for the purpose of such partition the said tract of land should be sold at public auction on the day in April, 1905, at which time the said tract of land was purchased

by me the said R.E. Johnston, and a deed therefor was duly executed unto me by J. W. Gray, Master for Greenville county, in said State, in obedience to said decree; which deed bears date the 12th day of April, 1905, and was duly recorded on said date in the last mentioned office, in deed Book, "K.K.K.", at page 128; the proceeding under which said land was sold being numbered "A2347" in the office of the Clerk of Court for said County and State; this tract of 200 acres being entirely surrounded by a tract of 1313-1/2 acres, conveyed by me, the said R.E. Johnston, to the said Border State Lumber Company, by deed bearing date the 12th day of September, A.D. 1904, and duly recorded on the same day in the office of the Register of Meane Conveyances for Greenville county, in said State, in Deed Book "M.M.M.", at page 147; -
