This indenture between J.H. Charles the lessor and Furman Ballou the lessee; witnesseth that the lessor agrees to lease to the lessee the tract of land situated in the said County, containing fifty five or sixty acres, known as the Hattie J. Charles place in Greve town-ship Greenville County, for agricultural purposes, to hold the same to the lessee from the first day of January, 1906 to the thirty-first day of December 1906 and the lessee on his part agrees to pay to the lessor, as rent for the same, half of all the cotton, corn, fodder, cotton-seed, wheat, and everthing grown on the place, which shall become due as soon as gathered, and delivered at Greenville, S.C. on any place that J.H. Charles may name and it agreed to secure payment of said rent the lessor shall have an agricultural lien on the crop produced on said land during the year, and all remedies to enforce the same, as provided by law, and the lessor shall keep up the terraces and hill-side ditches. the lessee agrees to take good care of the premises, and deliver possession of same at expiration of lease without further notice, and to use only refused or dead timber for domestic purposes. this agreement to bind the parties, their heirs, executors, and administrators.

NOW THEREFORE KNOW ALL MEN by these presents; that I, J.W. Quattlebaum, as Trustee, in consideration of the premises and by virtue of the deed of trust hereinabove mentioned and in the further consideration of the sum of one thousand six hundred and fifty (\$1650.00) dollars to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presence by L.K. Kelly, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said L.K. Kelly; all that certain lot or parcel of land situate in the City and County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, on Rutherford street in ward one (1): Beginning at a stake on the east side of Rutherford street 3x, Mrs. Sten's corner, and running; thence 587 E. 379 feet to a stake 3x; thence S. 115 feet 3x, McClellan's corner; thence N. 89 3/4 W. 379 feet to a stake 3x on said street; thence along said street N. 130 feet to the beginning corner, containing one acre and eight perches more or less, being the same property conveyed to the said Julius C. Smith by J.P. Latimer John H. Latimer and Elizabeth Crosby by deed dated 20th, day of September 1893 and recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds Conveyance for Greenville County, in Book A.A., page 128 to which reference is made for a more particular description of the said premises.

and I the said J.W. Quattlebaum, as Trustee, do hereby bind my-self, my heirs, executors, and administrators, to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said L.K. Kelly and his heirs and assigns from and against me and my heirs and the heirs of Julius C. Smith, Deceased lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
