KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That Mrs. Samuel Saunders and Edward Saunders of the City of Birmingham, State of Alabama in the State aforesaid, do for and in consideration of the sum of Five hundred Dollars, to us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by

J. W. Saunders of the State and County aforesaid (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Mrs. Samuel Saunders and Edward Saunders

hereafter acquire in all that certain piece parcel or tract of land situated being and being in the County of Greenville and State of South Carolina by the City Bridge road of two and one half miles from Greenville East House being known as the George Saunders place and containing forty four and one and one quarter acre or more being the same tract of land devised by George Saunders to his wife Mrs. S. J. Saunders by deed dated the 15th day of April 1875 in the office of the Judge of Probate for Greenville County in the year 1875 to her and her heirs and assigns for her life and at her death to go to her heirs and assigns forever and one and one quarter acre of gold and silver in the possession of Mrs. W. C. Conyer who has bought the interest of Sallie Saunders.

TOGETHER with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the said premises before mentioned, unto the said Mrs. S. J. Saunders and his Heirs and Assigns forever.

And us do hereby bind ourselves and our Heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular, the said premises unto the said Mrs. S. J. Saunders and his

Heirs and Assigns, against us and all Heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
