COUNTY OF GREENVILLE.) WHEREAS, on the 11th day of January 1908, Huguenot Mills was duly adjudged bankrupt by the District Court of the United States for the District of South Carolina, and the said J.B. Burgard was duly appointed and qualified as Trustee of the Estate of the said Huguenot Mills in bankruptcy, and is now acting as such Trustee, and on the 1st day of October 1908, said Trustee filed his certain petition in said District Court of the United States for the District of South Carolina praying for an order of sale of the real estate therein described upon the terms and conditions therein specified; AND WHEREAS, proceedings were had on said petition in accordance with the bankruptcy laws of the United States in such cases made and provided, and the petition coming on for a hearing on the 14th day of October 1908 at a meeting of the creditors of said bankrupt, of which notice had been duly given, and at said meeting a resolution having been passed authorizing the sale of said property by the Trustee at public auction under the terms and conditions specified in said petition, and on the same day in pursuance of said resolution an order of sale of said real estate therein described was duly signed by Julius H. Heyward, Esq. Referee in Bankruptcy, directing the sale to be made of the property therein described in the petition upon the terms and conditions specified; AND WHEREAS, said J.B. Burgard, Trustee of the estate of Huguenot Mills in bankruptcy having caused said premises to be appraised and the report of said appraisement to be filed with said Julius H. Heyward, Esq. Referee, and having on the 2nd day of November 1908, returned said order of sale to said Court as commanded, with the proceedings thereon, stating in substance that in obedience to said order he duly advertised the real estate therein described for sale in the Greenville Daily News, a newspaper printed in the City of Greenville
