That Greenville and Knoxville Railway Company, a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of South Carolina, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar to it in hand paid by Southern Railway Company, and of other good and valuable considerations, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has aliened, remised, released, relinquished and forever quit-claimed, and by these presents does alien, remise, release, relinquish, and forever quit-claim unto Southern Railway Company, a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Virginia, All and singular the estate, right, title and interest of Greenville and Knoxville Railway Company, in and to that certain strip, piece or parcel of land, situate and lying near the City of Greenville, in the County or Greenville and State of South Carolina, and being a strip of land thirty(30) feet in width or fifteen (15) feet on either side of the center line of that portion of the so-called Bleachery Spur Track, of the said Southern Railway Company, which extends through the land purchased by the grantor herein from one Springfield, being a part of the right of way for said Bleachery spur included in the conveyance made by Monaghan Mills to Southern Railway Company dated May 1st, 1903 and recorded in Book HHH, P., 632, in the office of R.M.C. for said Greenville County, South Carolina May 30th, 1903.

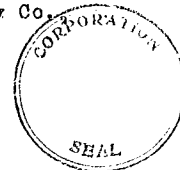
