Floyd Masters at and for the sum of Six Hundred (\$600.00) Dollars, NOW THEREFORE

J. Floyd Masters, in the State aforesaid
(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said J. Floyd Masters, all that tract of land situate in the County of Greenville, State

aforesaid, on Saluda River, containing One hundred and four acres, more or less, being the same conveyed to Wm. Masters by Thomas Masters the 20th., of October, 1861, by Deed recorded R.M.C. office of Greenville County in Book F.F. page 18.

Also all that tract of land adjoining the tract of land above described, situate in the County of Pickens separated from the foregoing tract by the Saluda River, the two virtually constituting one tract, the latter containing Eighty-nine acres, more or less saving and excepting however so much of the above described lands as had been conveyed off therefrom by the said Wm. A. Masters prior to his death leaving a balance of about One hundred and thirty-three (133) acres, said land being more fully described in the suit of Wm. A. Masters Vs. J. Floyd Masters et-al Court of Common Pleas Greenville County and begun on February 6th., 1892, and being the lands conveyed by J.D. Verner, Master to J.E. Hagood by deed dated Nov. 7th., 1892, and recorded R.M.C. office Greenville County in book X.X. p. 74.
