NOW, Therefore, Know all Men by these Presents, that I, J. W. GRAY, Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, by virtue of the aforesaid decree, in consideration of the performance of the conditions aforesaid, and the payment of Dollars, by the said

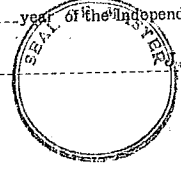
conveyed and released the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release, unto the said Lou Thompson, all that certain tract of land situate in Paris Mountain Township known as the Dower Tract, on plat of survey of lands of the Estate of Gabriel Thompson deceased, made by W.A. Hester on the 12th, day of November 1910, containing thirty-one (31) acres, more or less and having the following metes and bounds, to wit: Beginning on a stone OM on White Horse Road and running; thence N. 15 1/4 E. 19.50 to angle in Road; thence N. 38 E. 6.00 to iron pin in road; thence N. 85 W. 19.74 to stone in fork of branch; thence up branch S. 25 E. 3.00 to stone OM on branch; thence S. 39 1/4 W. 7.50 to stone XOM; thence S. 66 E. 7.93 to pine stump OM; thence S. 5 W. 13.25 to iron pin in road; thence S. 87 E. 8.43 to stone OM in White Horse Road, the beginning corner.

TOGETHER with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining; and all the estate, right, title, claim and interest whatsoever, of the parties to the cause aforesaid, and of each of them in and to the same; and of all other persons rightfully claiming from, under, or by these or any of them.

To HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the premisses before mentioned, unto the said Lou Thompson, her heirs and assigns forever.
