the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release, unto the said J. D. Plumley, his heirs and assigns, all that certain piece parcel or lot of land, lying

being and situate in Glassy Mountain Township, County and State aforesaid, on both sides of Pacolet River containing One Hundred and forty-five (145) acres, more or less, known as the William Gosnell Place, being the tract of land conveyed by William Griffin to William Plumley, Sr bearing date February 14th 1891, and described in said deed as "bounded by lands of Claborn Trammell, Levi Ward, William Plumley, Sr. and others."

TOGETHER with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining; and all the estate, right, title, claim and interest whatsoever, of the parties to the cause aforesaid, and of each of them in and to the same; and of all other persons rightfully claiming from, under, or by these or any of them.

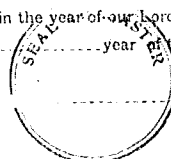
