WHEREAS G.W. Plumley as Administrator of the Estate of William Plumley deceased

of One Hundred and One - - - - Dollars, to me paid by the said R. E. Johnson,

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release,  
unto the said R. E. Johnson,

All that certain tract of land, in Glassy Mountain Township, County and State aforesaid, containing  
Sixty-Five (65) acres, more or less, known as the Francis Gosnell land, the metes and bounds of which  
appear in deed from Francis Gosnell, to Wm. Plumley, bearing date Dec 25, 1875, and are as follows:  
Beginning at a hickory on South side of Hogback Mountain; thence N. 90 E. 9.50 to stone corner; thence  
S. 69 E. to shoal <sup>over</sup> branch; thence up said branch to another shoal; thence to stake or dogwood corner;  
thence N. 55 E. 7.50 to a chesnut Oak; thence N. 23 W. 8 to a chesnut Oak by a large body of rock; thence  
N. 81 W. 15.50 to a chesnut; thence N. 22 W. 9.50 to a stake; thence N. 86 W. 9.50 to a hickory; thence S. 29  
W. 21.50 to a hickory the beginning corner.

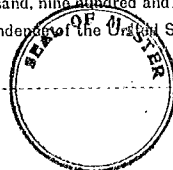
