G.A. Pittman, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release, unto the said G.A. Pittman

All that piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in the State and County aforesaid, containing One hundred acres, more or less, and having the following metes and bounds to wit: Beginning at a Maple and running; thence N. 69-3/4 W. 7.80 chains to a chestnut; thence S. 85-1/4 E. 3 chains to a branch; thence up the said branch as a line following the meanders thereof in a Northerly direction 28 chains to a stake; thence S. 85 W. 6.75 chains to a Chestnut; thence S. 51 W. to the Creek; thence up the Creek to a chestnut-oak on Charles Howard's place; thence S. 5 E. 5.33 chains to a Hickory; thence S. 56 E. 10.30 to a Chestnut; thence S. 87 E. 15 chains to a red-oak; thence due South 17 chains to a white oak 3X0; thence S. 38 W. 17 chains to a Black gum 3X0; thence S. 31 W. 7.27 chains to a Chestnut 3X0; thence S. 51-1/2 W. 17 chains to the Beginning corner, known as the McDevitt Tract Also all that certain piece, parcel or tract of land, situate, lying and being in Glassy Mountain Township, County and State aforesaid, on the North-west side of the Road leading from Old Columbia Road to Glassy Mountain Church, known as the Mary Gosnell tract, adjoining lands of Hamp Turner, S.L. To HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the premises before mentioned, unto the said G.A. Pittman, his

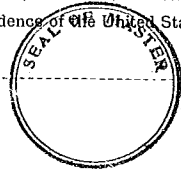
