(Will of Jules Ernest David)

County of Greenville.

I, Jules Ernest David, a duly naturalized citizen of the United States of America, and at this time a resident of the City of Geneva, in the Republic of Switzland, but temporarily in Greenville, in the State of South Carolina in the United States of America, do hereby make, publish and declare this my last will and testament, in manner and form following:-

First. I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon after my death as conveniently can be done.

Second. My house and lot, situate on the Grange Canal Road, in the County of Geneva, Switzerland conveyed to me by F. Gast, or other real-estate, that I may hereafter acquire, situate on said road, to enlarge said premises, I give, devise and bequeath to my wife,

Catherine Emma David, to have and to hold the same to her, absolutely, in fee simple, forever.

Third. In addition to all of the house-hold and kitchen furniture, books, pictures, jewelry, silver-ware and miscellaneous articles of personal property, that in common acceptance and understanding constitute the furniture and the furnishings of the house and premises, I give, devise and bequeath one (1/3) third of all the rest, residue and remainder of my estate, real, personal and mixed, wheresoever situate, of which I may die seized and possessed, or to which I may be entitled to the time of my decease, to my wife, the said Catherine Emma David, to have and to hold the same to her, absolutely and forever.

Full power and authority is hereby conferred upon my said wife, in obtaining her One (1/3) third to select and choose same, from such estate of my estate, as she may prefer.

Fourth. This provision for my wife is to be in lieu of all right of dower in my estate.

Fifth. I give, devise and bequeath the rest, residue and remainder of my estate, of every nature, kind and character, absolutely and forever, to my four children,

Florence Didiez David, Ernest Victorien David, Robert Francois David and Louise Dorothy David, the same to be divided among them equally, that is share and share alike.

Sixth. In the event a child, or children should hereafter be born to me and my said wife, I will and direct that said child or children, shall share equally in my estate, with my children above named:-

and in the event that any of my children shall have died before me, leaving lawful issue, him or her surviving, then I give, devise and bequeath to the surviving lawful issue of each child, so dying before me, the same to be distributed among such issue, share and share alike, per stripes and not per capita, the share the mother or the father, would have been entitled to, had he or she survived me, and been living at the date of my death.

Seventh. I hereby revoke all former or other wills and testamentary dispositions by me at any time heretofore made.

Eighth. I hereby appoint my wife, the said Catherine Emma David, the Guardian, both of the persons, and of the estate of my children, I further nominate and appoint my said wife, the Executrix of this my last will and testament, and direct that she shall not be required to give any bond or security for the proper discharge of her duties as Executrix, or to make annual returns before any Court or officer, and for her failure so to do, this my will shall be her sufficient warrant and authority.
