WHERERAS,

even date with these presents, well and truly indebted to.....

in the full and just sum of Dollars, to be paid

on the day of June, 1914, to the said E. Bailey,

with interest thereon from the day of June, 1914, at the rate of per cent. per annum to be

computed and paid monthly, until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note..... to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee of besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to

the amount due on said note....., to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney, or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note....., reference being thereunto had, as will more fully appear.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That the said E. Bailey,

in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said E. Bailey,

according to the terms of the said note....., and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to the said E. Bailey,

I, M. Hudson, in hand well and truly paid by the said E. Bailey,

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said E. Bailey,

all that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in Greenville County, State of South Carolina, in Saluda Township, on the ridge of Head of Rock Creek, on waters of Brush Creek and South ridge Rivers and having the following corners and bounded to wit:- Beginning at a Chestnut corner, and running thence N. 71° 45' E. 14' chain to a White Oak, thence 7.33 1/2 ft. 40' chain to a red Oak, thence S. 81 1/2 W. 4.40 chain to a stone, thence N. 02 1/2 E. 2.32 chain to a stone, thence N. 51 E. 10.79 chain to a stone, thence S. 45 1/2 E. 9.69 chain to a Black Gum, thence S. 13 1/2 W. 7.10 chain to a stone on the North side of the Ridge Road, thence S. 58 1/2 E. 8.90 chain to a stone, thence S. 48 1/2 W. 3.70 chain to a stone, thence S. 38 1/2 E. 13.70 chain to a small pine, thence S. 13 1/2 E. 2 chain to a double White Oak, thence S. 87 1/2 W. 2.10 chain to a Maple, thence S. 86 1/2 W. 2.73 chain to a stone, thence S. 2 E. 4.50 chain to a stake in Head of Mill Pond, thence S. 2 E. 7.50 chain to the beginning Chestnut corner and containing 45 1/4 acres, more or less, mostly all lying on the South side of said Ridge Road, about 2 miles west town Greenville and bounded by land now, or formerly owned by B. F. Geddes, Consett & Barnwell & Henry, Pettman and others, and being the same tract of land, conveyed to me the said E. Bailey, by R. J. Stewart, by his deed dated Aug. 15, 1918. To his mortgage is given to secure the payment of the balance of the purchase price on the above described tract of land.
