with interest thereon from date at the rate of eight per cent. per annum to be computed and paid quarterly

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee of ten per cent of the amount due upon said note besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to the amount due on said note to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney, or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note, reference being thereto had, as will more fully appear.

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said P. D. Bates

all that Certain piece, parcel and lot of land, situated in Butler Township, State and County aforesaid, adjoining land of J. L. Vaughan, Dr. W. S. Miller and others, being a part of a 108 acre tract of land purchased by J. A. Green from W. G. Sheppard and Maurice Hethclaw, by deed dated 20th December 1909 and recorded in Vol. 5 page 291, having the following meter and bounds:

Beginning at stone on D. Miller's line thence N. 47 $\frac{7}{8}$ E. 1381 to iron pin; thence N. 43 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 14.95 to iron pin in road; thence N. 24 $\frac{1}{4}$ E. 16.40 to iron pin in road; thence N. 31 W. 5.52 to iron post; thence N. 80 W. 26.17 to stone on branch; thence up the branch as a line S. 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 7.95 to sweet gum in fork of branches; thence S. 13 $\frac{1}{8}$ E. to stone post O. gone; thence N. 88 E. 12.08 to stone red oak gone; thence S. 20 E. 2.01 to stone the beginning, containing eighty-three (83) acres more or less.
