WHERERAS, the said John Lehmann

in and by a certain provisionary note in writing, of

even date with these presents, being well and truly indebted to

The Bank of Green, S.C. (\$2470.3)in the full and just sum of Twenty four hundred Seventy eight dollars

Dollars, to be paid as the same stated

with interest thereon from maturity date at the rate of Eight per cent. per annum to be computed and paid semiannual.until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee of Ten percent

besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to the amount due on said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney, or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note, reference being thereunto had, as will more fully appear.

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said

All that tract of land situate, lying and being in Highland Township, State and County aforesaid, on both sides of the Falls Beaverdam Creek, waters of Middle River Valley. Beginning at a stone and running thence N. 50° 34' E. 10.10 to a red oak: thence N. 50° 34' E. 27.00 ft. to stone: thence N. 26 1/2 E. 39.87 to stake: thence N. 45 E. for old Road 19.00 to rock corner, running South West, 10.35 to a black gum: thence S. West 22.08 to the beginning of said land being surveyed May 9th, 1873 by Thos P. Smith, containing, according to said survey 75 ac. 0, none or less, and during the same lands conveyed to Mr. Stokes, deceased, by John W. Gill Aug 4th, 1871, said 78 acres is herein surveyed less than acre. Conveyed to Mr. Stokes by Eliza Stokes, deceased Dec. 29th, 1906 and recorded in the office of R.M.L. for Greenville County in Vol. 777 at page 48.

Also all that other tract of land, situate, lying and being in Highland Township, State and County aforesaid adjoining the above described tract of land. Beginning at a stake and running thence S. 57 E. 14.00 to a black gum: thence S. 14.00 to a stake on William Stokes' line: thence S. 77 E. 26.950 to stone: thence N. 15.50 to the beginning corner, containing eight acres, more or less, and being the same tract conveyed to Singleton Stokes by William Lockhart and Eliza with Lockhart Sept. 15th, 1875, and recorded in R.M.L. office in Vol. 22, at page 562, said eight acres being conveyed to W. B. Stokes by his other, Singleton Stokes, by whom two tracts of land being the same conveyed to me by J. F. Stokes et al by deed dated May, 10th, 1919.
