WYNESSETH, whereof the said party of the first part is indebted to said MECHANICS PERPETUAL BUILDING AND LOAN ASSOCIATION in the sum of one hundred Dollars, money loaned this day, with interest thereon from this date at the rate of six eight per cent. per annum, payable weekly, the payment whereof the said party of the first part is anxious to secure:

Now therefore, in consideration of the premises, and in further consideration of one dollar to him in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said party of the first part has granted, bargained, sold, and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said party of the second part all that certain piece, parcel and lot of land lying in Greenville County, in the State aforesaid, as follows, to-wit:

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate on Mulberry Street, City of Greenville, State and County aforesaid, more particularly described as follows:
Beginning at a fence corner on the South east side of Mulberry Street, approximately one hundred and seventy one feet from Pinckney Street, at corner of lot conveyed to W.G. Serrine by me the 20th, day of July 1918, and running thence with Mulberry Street S. 58 W. forty-six feet, more or less, to fence post at southwest corner of property conveyed to Albert S. Johnstone by Henderson and Hunt, by deed dated December the 23rd, 1912, recorded in R.M.C. Office for Greenville County Vol. 24, page 313; thence with the southwest line of said property S. 30-1/2 E. two hundred feet, more or less, to fence post on back line of said property; thence with said back line N. 52-1/2 E. forty feet more or less, to fence post, corner of lot above stated conveyed to Serrine; thence with Serrine's line in a Northwesterly direction one hundred and ninety-five feet, more or less to the beginning corner. Being the same lot conveyed to me by Albert S. Johnstone by deed dated the 20th, day of July 1918 and not yet recorded.
