all that piece, parcel, tract or lot of land situated in *Greenville*
Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, *near Woodside Mills, commencing at*

a stone at the intersection of Union Street and Woodlawn Avenue, and running thence N. 74.26 E. 234 feet to a point which is the termination of Union Street; thence N. 15.20 E. 312 feet to a point on Woodlawn Avenue; thence S. 52.10 E. 389 feet to the beginning corner, being lots numbers 107, 108, 109 and 110 on a map of Downwood as surveyed by C. E. Dalton, Surveyor May 16th - 1910, with the exception of a right of way of G. S. & A. Railway Company 100 feet wide, beginning on the north side of Union Street and running in a general northerly direction, the same being more fully described in Vol. 15 page 30 as recorded April 20, 1911 in the office of the R. M. C. for Greenville County, and to which record reference is hereby made, being the same lots of land conveyed to W. D.
