WHEREAS, I, the said J. W. A. Wallard, in and by my certain promissory note, in writing, of even date with these presents, am well and truly indebted to,

Peoples Bank, in the full and just sum of Nine Hundred Thirty Dollars, to be paid Twelve months after date,

with interest thereon from Maturity at the rate of 8 per cent. per annum to be computed and paid Annually,

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note, to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee of.

Ten per cent. besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to the amount due on said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney, or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note, reference being thereto had, as will more fully appear.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, that I, the said J. W. A. Wallard,

in consideration of the said said lot and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment hereof to the said

Peoples Bank, according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to me, the said

J. W. A. Wallard, in hand well and truly paid by the said

Peoples Bank, at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said

Peoples Bank, all that certain piece parcel or lot of land situate

lying and being in the State and County aforesaid on waters of Clear Creek and South Tiger River, being part of tract #3 in a survey made by W. L. Adams in 1909 of which was formerly the Cleveland lands and purchased by W. D. Gilreath and J. D. Gilreath and having the following metes and bounds to wit:

Beginning at a stone, Green's corner on old outside line and thence N. 4 1/2 W. 4 1/2 N. 14.20 to stone, thence S. 65 3/4 W. 8.34 to W. O. thence N. 2.2 3/4 E. 13.14 to stake in branch, thence N. 4 1/2 E. 3.80 to head in branch, thence N. 14 E. crossing Clear Creek 8.75 to stake on bank of Tiger River, thence down the river to beech, thence S. 20 E. 31.28 W. D. thence S. 5 1/2 W. 9.79 to stone, thence S. 2 1/4 E. 2.20 to stone, thence S. 87 3/4 W. 11.37 to the beginning corner end containing 47 acres, more or less.

This being the same lot of land conveyed to me by M. G. and J. D. Gilreath by deed bearing date of Dec. 3rd, 1918, and recorded in Office of Rec. m. & G. Greenville County in Vol. 34 page 87.
