Dollars, to be paid Jan. 1st, 1921

with interest thereon from Jan 1st, 1920 at the rate of 7 per cent. per annum to be computed and paid annually, day by day.

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose the mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee of Ten per cent.

besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to the amount due on said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note, reference being thereto had, as well above fully appears.

according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to me, the said,

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said, J. P. Hippes,

All those certain parcels, pieces and tracts of land, situated lying and being in Custer Township, County and state aforesaid, bounded by lands of J. P. Hippes, A. R. Hunter, Mrs. Lizzie Black, and Miss Mary Thackston and more particularly described as follows:

Tract #1 That of fifty acres, more or less, being the same conveyed by D. L. Jones to J. D. Mayfield by deed dated Aug. 14, 1891 and recorded in the Office of R. M. C. for Greenville County in Vol. 44 at page 88 same having metes and bounds as follows: To-wit: Beginning at a stone 3x, J. P. Hippes' line and running thence S. 52° W. 35.72 to a stone 3x, thence S. 38° E. 14 ch to a stone 3x thence N. 52° E. 35.72 to a stone 3x thence N. 38° W. 14 00 to the beginning corner.

Tract #2 That of five and eight hundred acres more or less, being the same conveyed to J. D. Mayfield by Mrs. Lizzie Black, by deed dated Apr. 11, 1916 and recorded in office of R. M. C. for Greenville County in Vol. 39 p. 252 same having the following metes and bounds: To-wit: Beginning at a point in Georgia Road, Mary Thackston's line, and running thence S. 36° 12' E. 11.14 to a stone, thence S. 54° W. 5.37 to a stone, thence N. 28° 12' W. 11.33 to center of Georgia Road, thence along said road N. 55° 44' E. 3.80 to the beginning corner.

Tract #3 That of your lands (41.0) acres more or less - conveyed to J. H. Mayfield by Miss Mary Thackston by deed dated April 11th, 1916 and recorded in office of R. M. C. for Greenville County in Vol. 39 page 251 same, having following metes and bounds: To-wit: Beginning at a point in Georgia Road and running thence S. 36° 12' E. 11.14 to a stone, thence N. 32. 94 W. 11.14 to center of Georgia Road, thence S. 55° 44' W. 74 links to beginning corner.
