On the West side of the Fols Shals Road about 13 miles South of Greenville Court House, containing 61 4/10 acres more or less, according to survey made by W. J. Riddle December 17, 1919 being the same tract of land conveyed by Lucy Elvira Cureton to John M. Cureton June 18, 1904, deed recorded in Book 797, page 315. This tract is described in said deed as containing 66 1/2 acres, more or less.

Also that other tract of land in the Township, County and State aforesaid, adjoining the tract above described, containing 220 5/10 acres more or less, according to survey made by W. J. Riddle, December 17, 1919, being the same tract conveyed by P. D. Cureton, to Lucy E. Cureton October 17, 1890, by deed recorded in Book XX, page 287 and described in said deed as 216 1/2 acres, more or less.
