WHEREAS, the said W. P. Lupo
in and by my certain promise to pay note in writing, of
even date with these presents,

in the full and just sum of Four thousand four hundred and eighty eight
Dollars, to be paid in three equal annual installments and \$4,588.60
The first of which shall be due on January
1st, 1921, with the right to participate in all
all payments
with interest thereon from January 1st, 1921 at the rate of six per cent. per annum to be
computed and paid.

and in full, all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or
interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue
thereon and foreclose this mortgage, without further providing for an attorney's fee of Ten (10%) percent

besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to
the amount due on said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof,
be collected by an attorney, or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note, reference being
thereto had, as will more fully appear.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That the said W. P. Lupo
in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said

according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to me, the said

in hand well and truly paid by the said Howard Caldwell and

James M. Richardson
at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant,
bargain, sell and release unto the said Howard Caldwell and James M. Richardson,

their heirs, and assigns forever:

All those two certain lots and tracts of land
lying and being situate in the County and State
aforesaid and being a portion of the McDaniel
tract as shown by a plat of the same on
record in the office of the O.M.C. for Greenville
County, said tract being known and designated
on said plat as tract no. 8 and the
eastern portion of tract no. 9, said lands
being more specifically described as follows:

Tract no. 8 begins on Augusta Road at Mrs.
Sullivan's land and runs thence along Augusta
Road N. 37-03 W. 138 feet to corner; thence
S. 60-42 W. 202.7 feet to corner; thence S. 16 E.
74 feet; thence N. 84 E. 500 feet to a pipe;
thence N. 28-15 W. 844 feet to a stake; thence N.
64-45 E. 722 feet to the beginning corner, and
containing $4\frac{7}{100}$ acres, more or less.

Tract no. 9 begins at a stake on Old Road
and runs thence N. 84 E. 400 feet to corner of tract
no. 8; thence N. 6 W. 741 feet of tract no. 8; thence
S. 60-42 W. 35.3 feet to corner in road; thence
along road S. 14-43 W. 631.1 feet; thence S. 0-52 E.
129.4 feet to the beginning corner, and containing $3\frac{86}{100}$
acres, more or less.
