until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or  
interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue  
thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee

ten (10) per cent. of the amount due, besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to  
the amount due on said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof,  
be collected by an attorney, or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note, reference being  
thereto had, as will more fully appear.

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant,  
bargain, sell and release unto the said G. P. London, his heirs and assigns, forever

All that of law piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in Ward 1  
of the city of Greenville and in the state and county aforesaid being more  
fully described by metes and bounds as follows to wit:

Beginning at a stake 3x on the south side of Hampton Avenue on the  
corner of the lot of land now or formerly owned by J. J. McSwain, and  
running thence with the line of said J. J. McSwain lot 33° 55' W. one hundred  
sixty-five (165) feet to a stake 3x, thence south 33° 50' feet  
to a stake 3x, thence north 33° 50' feet one hundred sixty-one (161) feet to  
a stake on said Hampton Avenue, and thence with said avenue line 11  
35' W. fifty (50) feet to the beginning point, being the same lot of land
