All that tract of land situated in the county and state aforesaid, known as
 Riverwood land on the west side of the Middle Fork of Saluda River, being
 all of the tract of land known as the McJunkin tract that lies on
 said west side of the Middle Fork of Saluda River contained in the deed
 of John F. Goodwin to Victoria E. Jennings, the 2nd day of October 1883 and
 recorded in vol. 00, page 723.
