Released, and by these Presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release, unto the said J. B. Martin, his heirs and

assigns, all that piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in County and State aforesaid and Oaklawn Township, containing Fifty and one Half ( $50\frac{1}{2}$ ) acres, more or less, and bounded by lands of H. J. Eskew, S. W. Chandler, W. R. Pearson, S. W. Campbell, being same tract of land conveyed to George W. Stone by John R. Ridgway on Nov. 29, 1909 and recorded in R. M. C. office for said County in Vol. 5 page 260, and being the same tract of land conveyed to me by George W. Stone by deed bearing date 17th day Nov. 1913, recorded in R. M. C. office for said County in Vol. 23 page 407, recorded on Nov. 21, 1913.
