in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the mortgagor, Mr. L. O. Patterson, hereinabove named, according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to Mr. L. O. Patterson, the said mortgagor, in hand well and truly paid by the said mortgagor,

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said L. O. Patterson, ~~all~~ all my right, title interest and estate in and to all that certain piece of land, situate lying and being in the County of Greenville and State aforesaid, about four miles east of the city of Greenville, described as follows to-wit: Beginning at a point on the East side of Pelham and Batesville Road, at corner of David Wood, and running thence with said road S 42 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° W. 5.16 chains to stake at corner of Mrs. Mary D. Sullivan; thence along hedge S 47 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° E. 29.00 chains to stone corner thence S. 41° E. 4.00 chains to corner on holly tree, thence N. 62 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° E. 30.50 chains along line of Mrs. G. Glavin's bunch of maples, thence N. 50 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° W. 26.00 chains along line of Etta M.
