SEND GREETING:

WHEREAS, we, the said Neel G. Parish and Louise C. Gower

in and by our certain *Full Missouri* note in writing, of even date with these presents, well and truly indebted to

in the full and just sum of *12720* Dollars, to *us*

this *25* day of *Nov* 1924, at *Greenville* South Carolina, with interest thereon from *1st* date at the rate of *5* per cent. per annum, to be computed and paid *semi-annually*

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; and in case said note, after its maturity, should be placed in the hands of an attorney for suit or collection, or if before its maturity it should be deemed by the holder thereof necessary for the protection of his interests to place, and the holder should place, the said note or this mortgage in the hands of an attorney for any legal proceedings, then and in either of said cases the mortgagor promises to pay all costs and expenses, including 10 per cent of the indebtedness, as attorney's fees, this to be added to the mortgage indebtedness, and to be secured under this mortgage as a part of said debt.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That we, the said Neel G. Parish and Louise C. Gower

in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said *J. W. Norwood* according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to *us*, the said *Neel G. Parish and Louise C. Gower* in hand, well and truly paid by the said *J. W. Norwood*

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said *J. W. Norwood*.

All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being about two miles from Greenville Court House, on the north side of the road leading from Greenville to Laurens and being a portion of what was originally known as the McClister and Beattie farm, and having the following metes and bounds to wit:

Beginning at a stake in the center of the Laurens Road, corner now or formerly of Webster and running thence N. 20 E. 20.65 chains to a stone; thence N. 24 1/2 W. 6.50 chains to a stone; thence S. 68 1/4 W. 16.40 chains to a stake; thence S. 37 1/2 W. 10.20 chains to a stake in center of the Laurens Road. Thence with center of the said road, S. 57 E. 20.50 chains to beginning thirty-two (32) acres more or less as shown on plat made by W. P. Hudson, July 31st. 1891 and being the same tract of land conveyed to us by deed dated January 31st. 1920, by Mary C. Beattie, Executrix and individually and *J. F. Beattie*, Executor of the Estate of John C. Beattie, deceased.
