WHEREAS, I, C. O. Batson, the said C. O. Batson

On the 25th day of June A.D. 1921

with interest thereon from date at the rate of eight per cent. per annum to be computed and paid semi-annually

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee of one percent of the whole amount due thereon besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to the amount due on said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney, or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note, reference being thereunto had, as will more fully appear.

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Dr. C. White his heirs and assigns forever

All that certain piece of land situated, lying and being in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, and in the town of West Greenville, as shown by plat of W. H. Peeler, Engineer, made March 1912 of the property known as Perry Avenue Annex belonging to the estate of W. H. Drury, said plat being recorded in plat book No. 1 page 878, and having the following lines and boundaries, beginning at an iron pipe on the northeast side of Pendleton Street 240 feet from the intersection of Pendleton Street and Braxton Street, said corner later more 16 and 17, thence with line of lot No. 17 & 13.15 ft. 13.88.5 feet to an iron pipe on Braxton Street, thence 14.20 & 39.5 feet to an iron pipe joint corner later more 16 and 17, thence with line of lot No. 17 & 13.15 ft. 14.5.8 feet to an iron pipe on Pendleton Street, thence with Pendleton Street in 44 rd. 40 feet to the beginning, being iron pipe designated as lot No. 16 in plat affixed to and being the name lot engraved to me by W. P. Cooper, trustee and executor of the estate of W. H. Drury, Esquire, on the first day of April 1920, my deed recorded in the D.M.C. Office of Greenville County, in Book 59 page 282.
