I, J.B.L. Sudduth SEND GREETING:

WHEREAS, I, the said J.B.L. Sudduth

Dollars, to be paid as follows, Two thousand dollars to be paid Jan. 3rd, 1921 and Two  
thousand dollars to be paid Jan. 3rd, 1922

with interest thereon from the day of March 1921 at the rate of 7 per cent. per annum to be  
computed and paid

until in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or  
interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue  
thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee of

ten per cent besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to  
the amount due on said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof,  
be collected by an attorney, or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note, reference being

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant,  
bargain, sell and release unto the said N.E. Bright and Annie C. Berry, All that certain piece,

parcel or lots of land situate, lying and being in the State and County aforesaid and  
in Highland Township and known as Lots #4 and 5 on a plat of the M.E. Bright land as  
surveyed and sub-surveyed by B.F. Heves in Feb. 1920. Tract #4, having the following  
metes and bounds to-wit: Beginning at a point corner of tract #2 and runs thence N. 69  
W. 15.97 chs. thence N. 69 W. 18.54 chs. to a point; thence S. 6 W. 5.70 chs. to a point;
