in hand well and truly paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Stephen Nettles, attorney

all that piece, parcel, tract or lot of land situated in Greenville

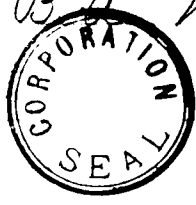
Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina,
