in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better
securing the payment thereof according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars to me
in hand well and truly paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and
released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Sue S. Smith

all that piece, parcel, tract or lot of land situated in Greenville

Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina,

Just outside the corporate limits of the city of
Greenville on David street near Pleasant street,
said lot having a frontage on David street of $4\frac{1}{3}$ feet
and running back in parallel lines a depth
of 150 feet on both sides and being $4\frac{1}{3}$ feet wide
in the rear and being the same lot conveyed to
Sue S. Smith by deed of even date herewith.
Said mortgage being given to secure the credit
portion of the purchase price.
