and if unpaid when due to bear interest at same rate as provided above, and I do hereby have further  
promised and agreed to pay ten per cent. of the whole amount due for attorney's fees, if said note is collected by an attorney or through legal proceedings of any  
kind, reference being had unto herein will more fully appear.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That I, the said Willie May Gilreath

in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better  
securing the payment thereof according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars to me

do hereby hand well and truly paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and  
released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said People's National Bank, Executor Estate of Deceased  
all my right title and interest, the same being an undivided 1/2 interest in  
all that piece, parcel, tract or lot of land situated in

Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina.

*In the corporate limits of the city of Greenville, on the corner of Buncombe and Duncan Streets fronting 103 feet on Buncombe Street and running back 104 feet on Duncan Street and being part of same lot of land conveyed to Leuca Gilreath by B. J. DeWitt, master by deed dated June 7, 1880 said deed recorded in Book 200, page 695 has a small lot on Duncan Street heretofore conveyed to Nelson Gilreath and being the same lot left to Willie May Gilreath and Paul Ellen Gilreath by the last will of Leuca Gilreath deceased.*
