in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better  
securing the payment thereof according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars to meI hand well and truly paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and  
released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Peoples National Bank, Executor Estate of  
Daingerfield all my right title and interest, the same being as con-  
sidered above, in  
all that piece, parcel, tract or lot of land situated in

Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina,

In the corporate limits of the City of Greenville, on the corner  
of Burcondale and Duncan Streets, fronting 103 feet on Burcondale  
Street and running back 104 feet on Duncan Street and being  
part of some 18 of land conveyed to Jessie Gilreath by  
E. J. Deuthil, Master by deed dated June 1, 1880, said deed  
recorded in Book K page 695 less a small lot on  
Duncan Street heretofore conveyed to Helton Gilreath and  
being the same lot left to Willie May Gilreath and  
held Ellen Gilreath by the last will of Jessie Gilreath  
deceased.
