of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the term of the said R. Skalowski

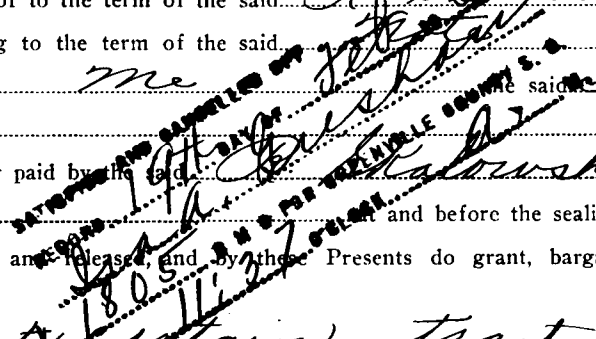
and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to me, according to the term of the said Jay Pittman
