computed and paid

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due shall bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or
interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who
may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note in the event of default for a ten per cent. of amount
due besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to
the amount due on said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part
thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note, reference
being thereunto had, as will more fully appear.

or parcel of land, lying, situate and being in Greenville Township, State and County
aforesaid, near City limits of City of Greenville, being described as lots Nos. 69, 70
and fifteen feet off of the Western side of lot No. 71, in the subdivision of the Theron
Earle property, known as Oaklawn, as per plat made by the Fitzpatrick-Terry Company, dated
May 6, 1920 and recorded in office of Register of Mesne Conveyances for Greenville County,
S.C. in Plat Book E, at page 273, and being the same tract of land as this date conveyed to
me by the said A.H. Taylor, and this mortgage is being given to secure a portion of the
purchase price.
