with interest thereon from date at the rate of 8 per cent. per annum to be
computed and paid annually

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or
interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who
may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee of

ten per cent besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to
the amount due on said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part
thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note, reference
being thereunto had, as will more fully appear.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That I, C.F. Putman the said C.F. Putman

in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said

Mary E. Woodson

according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to me, the said

C.F. Putman

in hand well and truly paid by the said

Mary E. Woodson

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do

grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Mary E. Woodson, All that certain tract of land in County and

State aforesaid, containing 50 acres, more or less, and being the same this day conveyed to
me by Mary E. Woodson, reference to said deed and also to deeds recorded in Book UU, at
page 482 and Book WV, at page 274 for a fuller description of said lands; this obligation
being made to secure a balance due on the purchase price.

And this obligation is subject to the securing of renunciation of dower from the wives of
the heirs of Robert Bruce through whom this tract of land comes.
