WHEREAS, I, J. A. Holliday, in hand well and truly paid by the said Bank of Belton, Belton, S.C. at and before the sealing and delivery of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these Presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release, unto the said Bank of Belton, its successors and assigns forever:

All that certain piece parcel or tract of land situate lying and being in Greenville County, State of South Carolina on the Coolidge Bridge road, containing fifteen acres more or less, and being more particularly prescribed by deed of G. V. Vaughn, as executor of the last will and testament of Martha A. Holliday, deceased said deed being dated Dec. 12, 1918.
