grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said

Piedmont Lumber Company, and its successors and
assigns, all that certain piece, parcel or lot of land,
situate, lying and being in the state and county
aforesaid, and being partly within and partly
without the city limits Greenville, and being known
as a portion of lot #14, in Block B, as shown on plat
of O. P. Mills property, which plat is recorded in R. M. C
office for said county and state in Plat Book "C" at
page 284, and having the following metes and bounds
to-wit: Beginning at an iron pin at the intersection
of Mills Avenue and Elm street and running thence
N. 36-14 W. 130 feet to an iron pin on Elm street;
thence in a line parallel with Mills Avenue
S. 45-27 W. 68.5 feet to an iron pin in line of lot No. 13;
thence with line of lot No. 13 and parallel with Elm Street
S. 36-14 E. 120 feet to an iron pin on Mills Avenue, thence
with Mills Avenue N. 45-27 E. 68.5 feet to the beginning
corner. Being a portion of the same lot conveyed to
me by Mrs. Annie M. Moore by deed dated February
