Decree

The above case was begun in the County Court of Greenville County and was docketed on calendar 1. However, it appearing unto the Court that this was an equity proceeding, an order was passed on February 23<sup>rd</sup>, 1926, referring this matter to Hon. LeRoy Moore, Master of Spartanburg County, with the request that he hold a reference and report his findings to this Court. He has held a reference and found that the plaintiff was entitled to the relief demanded in his complaint, and it appearing from the entire record that the plaintiff has established his claim by the preponderance of the evidence and that he is entitled to the note and mortgage referred to in his complaint;

Therefore, it is ordered that the note and mortgage bearing date December 4<sup>th</sup>, 1922 for the sum of \$474.83, given by B. B. Ellison to Carrie Middlebrooke, which is now held by the American Bank and Trust Company be delivered to the plaintiff, R. H. Moseley, or his attorney, and also all moneys which have been paid by B. B. Ellison to the American Bank and Trust Company on said note.

It is further ordered that the defendant, B. B. Ellison, be required to make all future payments to the plaintiff, or his attorney; and that all rights to the said note and mortgage which the said T. B. Butler, Trustee in Bankruptcy for R. L. Middlebrooke, Bankrupt, and also all rights of the defendant, Mrs. Carrie Middlebrooke, to the said money and note and mortgage be forever barred.
