WHEREAS, I, Bettie Satterfield
in and by my certain promissory note in writing, of
even date with these presents, am well and truly indebted to

Fannie C. Scott as Probate Judge for said County & State
in the full and just sum of Five hundred

Dollars, to be paid

with interest thereon, from date until paid at the rate of seven per cent. per annum, to be
computed and paid annually

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or
interest be at any time past due and unpaid; then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due at the option of the holder hereof,
who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; said note further providing for an attorney's fee of ten per cent of
the amount due besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be
added to the amount due on said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or
any part thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage; as in and by the said note, reference

of my undivided right, title and interest of, in and to all that tract of land situate in the
County and State aforesaid, about 4-1/2 miles Southwest of the City of Greenville and known as a
part of the John A. Satterfield land, and more particularly described as follows:

11.00 to a stone 3x11; thence N. 24 E. 20.45 to a stone 3x11; thence N. 66 W. 23.14 to a stone
3x11 in Stanton Bridge Road or Greenville Road; thence down the center of said road S. 18-1/2 W.
4.40 to a bend; thence down said road S. 27-3/4 W. 8.00 to a bend in road; thence S. 15-1/2 W.
