Howard, Ed Turner, et al; this being the same tract of land which belonged to Peter Gosnell, late of the said State and County at the time when he died leaving of full force and effect his last will and testament which was duly admitted to probate by the Probate Court of said County and State, and is now on file in said Court, in apartment 52, File 25, by which will he devised and bequeathed to his wife, Caroline Gosnell, all of his property, real and personal, including the said tract of land, thereupon the said Caroline Gosnell executed to Sherman and Mayfield a mortgage covering said tract of land, said mortgage bearing date March 7, 1890, recorded Book "AA" of Mortgages, at page 168; which mortgage was assigned by the said Sherman and Mayfield to S. C. Smith on April 18th, 1890, the said S. G. Smith having died intestate on on April 1st, 1892, and one, Chas. I. Gilreath, having been thereupon appointed his administrator and having instituted a proceeding in the Court of Common Pleas for said State and County against the said Caroline Gosnell and others, for the foreclosure of the mortgage above referred to; a decree having been duly rendered by said Court in said proceeding, bearing date Marh 25, 1893, ordering said land to be sold by the Master for said County on sales day in the Month of November 1893; all of which will more fully appear by reference to Judgment Roll number A 567 in the office of the Clerk of Greenville County in said State; the said land having been accordingly sold on said date to Mrs. Ella C. Mooney to whom a deed therefor was duly executed and delivered by the late D. P. Verner, Master for said County, bearing date November 5, 1893, and recorded in Office of Register of Mesne Conveyances for said County and State on December 20, 1893, in Deed Book "AAA" page 676; the said Ella C. Mooney having thereafter departed this life, leaving of full force and effect her last will and testament which was duly admitted to Probate on May 21, 1903, by the Probate Court for said State and County recorded in Will Book "H" at page 559, in the office of said Court by which will she devised the said tract of land to Mrs. Elizabeth M. Sevier, who conveyed the same to me, the said R. E. Johnston, by deed bearing date Sept.1904, and recorded in the office of the Reg. of Mesne Conveyances on Oct. 11, 1904, in Deed Book "NNN" at page 153.
