SEND GREETING:

WHEREAS, we, the said *S. J. Jenkins & Lora Jenkins*, in and by 116 certain July 1st 1918 note in writing, of even date with these presents, 116 well and truly indebted to

The Farmers Bank of Simpsonville
in the full and just sum of One Thousand Dollars ^{plus interest & 3% / 100}
Dollars, to be paid 22nd 1st 1926

with interest thereon, from 1st January at the rate of 8 per cent. per annum, to be computed and paid and thereafter

..... upon paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid; then the whole amount evidenced by said note..... to become immediately due at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; said note further providing for an attorney's fee of less per cent.

..... besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to the amount due on said note..... to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage; as in and by the said note....., reference being thereto had, as will more fully appear)

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That we the said *S. J. Jenkins & Lora E. Jenkins* in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said

Farmers Bank of Simpsonville according to the terms of said note....., and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to as, the said

S. J. Jenkins & Lora E. Jenkins in hand well and truly paid by the said Farmers Bank of Simpsonville

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents, do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Farmers Bank of Simpsonville, its successors

and assigns; all that certain piece of land and tract of land situate lying and being in the State and County aforesaid, bounded by lands of J. A. Martin, B. W. Burdett, Estate of W. A. Peacock & others, containing fifty acres, more or less, and being the same land conveyed to said *S. J. Jenkins* by Florence D. Hunter by deed dated Jan. 23rd 1915, and recorded in the office of R. M. C. for Greenville County in Vol. 35 at page 41, also same tract one-half undivided interest in which was conveyed to said Lora Jenkins by *S. J. Jenkins* by deed dated Feb. 27th 1915 and recorded in office of R. M. C. for Greenville County in Vol. 51 at page 96.

This conveyance is junior to one given to D. D. Richardson Feb. 13-1918 in the sum of \$1500⁰⁰ and as relates to *S. J. Jenkins* one-half interest is also junior to moiety given to Avery Patton for fertilizer some 3 yrs. ago.
