All of that certain piece, parcel or tract of land, lying, being and situate in O'Neal Township, on waters of Enoree River, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, and more particularly described as follows: Beginning at a point marking the extreme southeastern corner of the within described tract, which point marks corner with lands now or formerly owned by R.L. Andrea, and which point is marked by an iron pin in the State Road, and an old road, thence along the cent of said old road, as the same meanders with the following calls: due North 4.70 chs. to bend in old road; thence N. 6° W. 8.38 chs. to a bend; thence N. 26-1/2° W. 8.70 chs. to an iron pin; thence leaving said old road S. 64-3/4° W. crossing said State Road 2.41 chs. to a stone; thence N. 24° W. 1.42 chs. to a maple; thence N. 76-1/2° W. 3.62 chs. to a persimmon; thence S. 68° W. 2.85 chs. to an ash; thence N. 4° E. 78 links to a stone; thence S. 78° W. 17.17 chs. to a stone; thence S. 41-1/2° W. 20.94 chs. to a stone; thence S. 6-1/2° E. 6.00 chs. to a stone; thence N. 81-1/3° E. 42.50 chs. to the point and place of beginning; said tract containing 73 acres, according to survey made by W.A. Hester, Surveyor, under date of March 8, 1918 and being the same property conveyed to the said L.E. Thompson, from Henry Forrester, et als. by deed dated Sept. 27, 1915, and recorded in Deed Book 38, at page 56 in the Clerk's office of Greenville County, South Carolina.
