in the full and just sum of *three thousand two hundred fifty (\$3,250.00)*
Dollars, to be paid \$750.00 one year after date and \$250.00 two
years after date with the privilege of anticipating
payment at part or all at any time.

with interest thereon, from *date*, *1927*, at the rate of *7* per cent. per annum, to be
computed and paid *semi-monthly*.

..... until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or
interest be at any time past due and unpaid; then the whole amount evidenced by said note..... to become immediately due at the option of the holder hereof, who
may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; said note further providing for an attorney's fee *plus (15%) percent*.

..... besides all costs and expenses of collection to be added to the amount due on said note..... to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any
part thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage; as in and by the said note....., reference
being thereunto had, as will more fully appear.)

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents, do grant,
bargain, sell and release unto the said *C. H. Stokes* all of that Certain lot of

land situate, lying and being on the west side of Rowley
Street in the City of Greenville, Greenville County, State
of South Carolina and having the following metes and
bounds to wit: Beginning at an iron pin on said Street
317 feet in a northerly direction from the Northwest Corner
of East Park Avenue and Rowley Street and running
thence north ~~west~~ Rowley Street North 20° 19' E. 58 1/2 feet
to an iron pin on said Street; thence North 77° W. 20 7
feet 9 1/2 inches, to an iron pin on an 18 foot alley;
thence South 20° 19' W. 58 1/2 feet to an iron Pin; thence
South 77° E. about 20 6 1/2 feet to the beginning corner, and
