

State Line, all in Harford County, Maryland. Included in this main line loop section is a main line valve with double crossovers to Lines "A" and "B" at the beginning of the section.

PENNSYLVANIA

Four main line sections in Pennsylvania, totaling approximately 45.31 miles in length described as follows:

(a) One 24-inch main line section approximately 9.49 miles in length, beginning at valve 520LA20 located in Leidy Township, Clinton County, and continuing in a northwesterly direction to the header assembly at Compressor Station 535 located in Potter County, all in the State of Pennsylvania. Included in this loop section is a main line valve and scraper trap assembly at Compressor Station 535.

(b) One 24-inch main line loop (Line "B") section approximately 15.75 miles in length, beginning at valve 515LB40, M.P. 113.76 on the 24-inch Leidy Line, located in Sugar Loaf Township, Columbia County, and continuing in a westerly direction to valve 515LB-50, M.P. 129.51, located in Pennsylvania Township, Lycoming County, all in the State of Pennsylvania. Included in this loop section is a main line valve and scraper trap assembly with double crossover to Line "A" at the beginning of the section and a main line valve and scraper trap assembly with double crossover to line "A" at the end of the section.

(c) One 36-inch main line loop ("C") section approximately 13.40 miles in length, beginning at MLV 195C20 located at M.P. 1708.85 in Valley Township and continuing in an easterly direction to Compressor Station 200, located in East Whiteland Township at Milepost 1722.24, all in Chester County, Pennsylvania. Included in this loop section is a main line valve, at the beginning of the section, with a crossover to Main Line "B" and a main line valve with double crossover to main lines "A" and "B" at Compressor Station 200.

(d) One 36-inch main line loop "C" section approximately 6.67 miles in length, beginning at the Maryland-Pennsylvania State Line and continuing in an easterly direction to the west side of the Susquehanna River, all in York County, Pennsylvania. Included in this main line loop section are two main line valves, one sending and one receiving trap assemblies, and suction and discharge lines at Compressor Station 195; one main line valve (R-7) with double tie-over to the river header at the west side of the Susquehanna River.
