

Prince William County, Virginia
Property Purchased in Lieu of R/W

That certain tract of land conveyed to the Company by deed from I. J. Breeden, et al, dated August 13, 1962, recorded in Book 287, page 280 in the office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Prince William County, Virginia, and being described as follows: All that certain lot or parcel of land lying and being situate in Manassas Magisterial District, Prince William County, Virginia, and being more particularly described according to a plat and survey, (attached thereto and made a part thereof) made by R. M. Bartenstein and Associates, dated July 18, 1962, as follows: "Beginning at an iron pipe on the southerly right of way of Route 621, a corner to Aldrich, thence running with the line of Aldrich, S17 degrees 29'26"E 1637.93 feet to a pipe, thence through the land of Breeden S79 degrees 50'30"W 526.44 feet to a concrete monument, a corner to the Transcontinental Gas Pipe Line Corporation land, thence with said land N10 degrees 09'30"W 1434.37 feet, to an iron pipe in the southerly line of Route 621, thence running with said highway line, N48 degrees 10'30"E 275.80 feet to the point of curvature, thence running with a curve to the right, which radius is 929.93 feet, an arc distance of 94.35 feet to the point of beginning, containing 15.0576 acres of land," and being a portion of the land conveyed to I. J. Breeden by deed dated September 12, 1961 and recorded among the land records of Prince William County in Deed Book 274, page 424.

Potter County, Pennsylvania

(Wharton Compressor Station)

That certain tract of land conveyed to the Company by deed from Charles D. Copeland, Jr., et al, dated August 11, 1961, and recorded in Book No. 166, Page 301, of the Deed Records of Potter County, Pennsylvania, and being described as follows: All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, situate, lying and being in Wharton Township, Potter County, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, bounded and described according to plan made by John R. Hennemuth, Registered Civil Engineer, dated November 30, 1960, as follows, to wit: BEGINNING at a concrete monument, the Southeast corner of Warrant #4922, said corner being also a common corner of Warrant #4735, 4918 and 4921; thence along the dividing line between #4922 and 4921, South Eighty-nine degrees, Twenty-one minutes West, Fourteen hundred Fifty-one and Thirteen one-hundredths feet to a concrete monument; thence over and across Warrant #4922, North one degree, Thirty-
