

dale County, DeKalb County, to the west end of the existing loop at mile post 1063.73, located in Town G.M.D. 476, Rockdale County, all in the State of Georgia. Included in this main line loop section are a main line valve and scraper trap assembly and a discharge tie-over to line "B" at Compressor Station 120, a main line drip assembly at mile post 1052.27, and a tie-over to line "A" service line to Stockbridge M&R at mile post 1050.23.

(b) One 36-inch main line loop (line "C") section, approximately 23.78 miles in length, beginning at Compressor Station 130 at approximate mile post 1124.71, located in Madison County, and continuing in an easterly direction, crossing Elbert and Hart Counties, to the center of the Savannah River, which is the State line between the States of Georgia and South Carolina. Included in this main line loop section are a main line valve assembly with double cross-over to lines "A" and "B" at Compressor Station 130, a main line drip assembly at mile post 1129.65, a main line valve assembly with double cross-overs to lines "A" and "B" at approximate mile post 1136.76, and a river valve with tie-over to the header assembly at the Savannah River.

(c) One 42-inch main line loop (line "D") section, approximately 1.60 miles in length, beginning at approximate mile post 1033.66, and continuing in an easterly direction to the end of the loop section at approximate mile post 1035.26, all in G.M.D. 1248, Fayette County, Georgia.

(d) One 42-inch main line loop (line "D") section, approximately 6.75 miles in length, beginning at approximate mile post 1108.83, located in Hurricane G.M.D. 755, and continuing in an easterly direction to the end of the loop section at approximate mile post 1115.58, located in Fifth G.M.D. 646, all in Coweta County, Georgia.

#### SOUTH CAROLINA

Three 36-inch main line loop (line "C") sections in South Carolina, totaling approximately 32.28 miles in length, described as follows:

(a) One 36-inch main line loop (line "C") section, approximately 0.57 miles in length, beginning at the center of the Savannah River, which is the State line between the States of Georgia and South Carolina, and continuing in an easterly direction to the existing river valve
