I, Wade H. Plumley

SEND GREETING:

WHEREAS, I, the said Wade H. Plumley
in and by my certain Promissory note in writing, of
even date with these presents, am well and truly indebted to

Peoples National Bank of Greenville, as executor of the
estate of D. D. Davenport
in the full and just sum of Eight hundred (\$800.00)
Dollars, to be paid one year after date

with interest thereon, from date at the rate of eight per cent. per annum, to be
computed and paid Annually

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal
or interest be at any time past due and unpaid; then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due at the option of the holder hereof who
may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; said note further providing for an attorney's fee of Ten Per cent besides all costs and expenses of collection to be
added to the amount due on said note to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any
part thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage; as in and by the said note, reference being
thereunto had, as will more fully appear.)

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That I, the said Wade H. Plumley
in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said Peoples National
Bank as executor

according to the terms of said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to me, the said

Wade H. Plumley
in hand well and truly paid by the said Peoples National Bank as
Executor of the estate of D. D. Davenport.

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents, do grant,
bargain, sell and release unto the said Peoples National Bank of Greenville, as
executor of the Estate of D. D. Davenport.

Lands described as follows in the will of William
Plumley: all that certain tract of land in the County
and State aforesaid, having the following metes
and bounds: Beginning at M. L. Durham's old ware-
house of the Government distillery on my spring branch,
on a locust 3 feet east of warehouse on a conditional
corner made by me and B. J. Barnett and running
down my spring branch to Pacolet River, then up
the river near 50 yards to a branch on south
side of Pacolet River, a Shoal, to a large chestnut,
mine and Evans and B. J. Barnett, thence near east
with mine and B. J. Barnett's line to a stone in Ridge
Road, corner of mine and B. J. Barnett's land; thence
near north with this line to mine and M. L. Durham's
corner; thence with mine and Durham's line near a
north course by our various corners to Malon Balvie's
and M. L. Durham's corner; thence near a north course
with mine and Malon Balvie's line on the mountain
far enough to run due south to the beginning corner.
This being the land willed to me, W. H. Plumley, by
my father, William Plumley, by his will dated 1898
and this conveying to me 26 1/2 acres of land;

From this, however, I have conveyed to F. R. Pitman
15 acres by deed dated 1914, recorded in R. M. S. office
in Book 26, at Page 317.

Bounded by lands now or lately belonging to
Margan, W. L. Plumley, W. M. Lockhart, deceased, and
Markis Plumley.
